It is said that the report of Paramount Blount concerning the situation in Hawaii is accompanied by a recommendation that the people of the dis- traught islands shall decide by a vote of all the people what government they shall have for the future. If this is the substance of the result of the investigations of Cleveland's personal representative it is a most complete confirmation of the very common belief that his mission was a farce. How can the president, or any other power in the United States, dictate that the provisional government now in control in the islands shall submit any question whatever to the people there? It is well known that the natives of the islands are numerically in the majority, and it is understood that they are almost unanimous in favor of a restoration of the monarchy. Any proposition that the American government shall engage in the rebuilding of ruined thrones would be extremely repulsive at home, even if the present government of the islands should be disposed to entertain the proposition and take its chances in the outcome of the vote. But there is not the remotest probability that the provisional authorities there would for a moment entertain a proposition of the sort, nor would it lead to good results in any way. The question has now been long before the government at Washington. It might have been settled under the administration of President Harrison just as well, as justly and as intelligently as now.
