

## THE SALOONS CLOSED.

### Argentino Practically Without a Tippling Shop Open Yesterday.

The police succeeding in capturing one man for violating the late order of Mayor Williard. He sold a pint of beer near the depot. He gave the name of William Banner and was fined \$20 and costs. He has probably left town as no one has seen him since. An actual drouth prevailed yesterday in the liquor market. Not even a liquor wagon is permitted to drive along the street and the order will be strictly enforced. The arrest of Banner has frightened the other dealers and yesterday every back door was closed. None of the liquor men could be found on the street and it was reported they are holding a meeting for the purpose of deciding upon some plan of carrying on a warfare against the order.

Mayor Williard stated that the order was issued for the reason that when he took the oath of office he intended to sustain the law if he could and he had become tired of looking on the illegal traffic with impunity. He proposes to keep the joints closed. The jointists charge that Mayor Williard is taking this method of bringing a stubborn Council to time in the matter of affirming some of his favorites for office. The fight promises to be a long one.
