

## ARGENTINE.

### A Calm Reigns Supreme in Argentine Among City Officers.

A calm in municipal circles was experienced by the citizens yesterday after the heavy storms of Tuesday night and Wednesday, caused by the encounter between Mayor Williard and Councilman West. The latter yesterday went into court and paid his fine, and also served notice on Mr. Williard that he would not prosecute him under the complaint sworn out. He admitted on the witness stand that he was under the influence of liquor and used some pretty rough language to Williard.

All indications now are that the "scrap" will be the cause of peace and harmony resuming its natural channels among the city officers and from now on the probability is that things will run smoother in the Council.

Mayor Williard has ordered the "hop tea joints" to close or pay a fine of \$26.75. Accordingly all were notified and all but five closed. They paid their fine and continued to operate.

### Another Councilmanic Fracas.

E. Z. McCollough, ex-councilman and capitalist, yesterday caused a warrant to be issued for the arrest of Councilman Ed Blundon on the charge of disturbing the peace. In the complaint it is alleged that the act was committed Tuesday night following the Williard-West set-to. It is claimed Blundon was considerably worked up at the time, when McCollough came to where he was standing and began a conversation with City Attorney Crawford relative to the Santa Fe viaduct suit, which made Blundon mad.
