

# BASE BALL FOR THE WEST.

DENVER, PUEBLO, OMAHA, WICHITA,  
TOPEKA AND KANSAS CITY.

**That Will Be the Circuit Decided Upon at  
This Afternoon's Meeting of the  
Base Ball Solons—General  
Sporting Notes.**

The organization of the new Western league will be effected at a meeting at the Midland hotel at 3 o'clock this afternoon with Denver, Pueblo, Omaha, Topeka, Wichita and Kansas City as the circuit.

The committee, sent to St. Joseph last night for the purpose of inducing the base ball club of that city to join the league, returned home this morning, and while there was little encouragement given by the parties now in control of that team, there is still some hope of securing a representation of that town. An effort will also be made to induce Leavenworth to put in a team and an eight club circuit will thus be provided for.

There are now delegates here representing Denver, Pueblo, Omaha, Wichita and Topeka, and the organization for a six club league will be perfected this afternoon, but St. Joseph and Leavenworth will still be given an opportunity to come in. Officers will be elected and committees on organization, railroad transportation, constitution, schedule, etc., appointed who will meet at a subsequent meeting to fill in all the details of organization and preparation for the opening of the season about May 20. All of the clubs with the exception of Omaha and Wichita have grounds ready to play on, and players will be signed and exhibition games take place within ten days from this date from the present outlook.

The delegates who will participate in this afternoon's session will be J. W. Speas of Kansas City, George Tebeau of Denver, who also represents Pueblo, J. T. McVittie of Omaha, C. M. Fechheimer of Wichita and D. G. Cooley of Topeka. They are all enthusiastic over the proposed organization and confident that it can be carried through a four and a half months' season successfully.
