

THE collapse of the Western association does not signify, necessarily, that the public has lost its interest in base ball. Kansas City has been accustomed to a better class of players than were embraced in the local league, and the enterprise failed for the reason that the games were not up to the requisite standard. To revive an interest in base ball here, Kansas City must be identified with some of the associations which take in cities of its own class.
