

FOR AND AGAINST THE GAME.

**The Faculty of the University of California
Will Investigate Foot Ball.**

SAN FRANCISCO, CAL., Dec. 2.—The faculty of the University of California are considering an order prohibiting any more inter-collegiate foot ball contests. Those favoring the order object to the contests because the personal injuries that result from the game interfere with studies of the students, the effect on the spectators which they say is similar to that produced by witnessing a bull fight and the greed for gain which is engendered by the business-like manner in which the contests are conducted. Foot ball, they say, has become a business, not a sport. Much of the opposition to the game comes from professors who are friendly to athletics and who say there is no objection to inter-collegiate competition in other sports.
