

GROCERS CUT OFF CREDIT.

Their Association Decides to Sell for Cash Hereafter.

The Retail Grocers' association held a meeting last night in the Nelson building and resolved to give no more credit to their customers. The action of the association is attributed to the hard times and the scarcity of money and it was thought that it would be for the best interest of the members to sell their goods only for cash. The association decided to give a masked ball next November either in the Exposition building or the Auditorium.

Proposed Reduction in Police Salaries.

The board of police commissioners held a meeting yesterday afternoon and discussed retrenchment, but took no action to save the necessary \$400 a month. The board is considering a reduction of 3 per cent in salaries. The patrolmen now get \$70 a month, having been reduced \$5 a month after the reorganization a year ago.

"The firemen are paid \$80 a month and are fighting a reduction," said a city official to-day, "while the policemen are on their feet and out in all kinds of weather twelve hours at a stretch, on day and night duty alternating months, and never complain."
