

FOR THE UNEMPLOYED.

A Plan to Provide Work by Co-Operative Enterprise.

H. F. Sleepack, secretary of the Industrial council, is at work on a plan to give work to unemployed labor by the establishment of small-manufacturing enterprises. His proposition is to raise a fund of about \$1,000 by subscription to start a saddlery and harness shop on a small scale that will give employment to about twenty of the harness and saddle makers who are now out of work. He says that the sympathy of the farmers can be enlisted in the matter and the product of the factory be exchanged for the products of the farm, and that it would be able to secure a sufficient patronage from union men in the city and the Farmers' alliance in the country to make it a success.
