

SMOKING ON CABLE CARS.

The Keeley League Discusses the Question
but Takes No Action.

At a meeting of the women's auxiliary to the Keeley league in the Ridge building yesterday afternoon, the question "Shall men be permitted to smoke on street cars," was discussed. The question came up incidentally after Dr. I. M. Ridge had delivered an address on the bad effect of the use of tobacco and after a short discussion was dropped without action. One of the members of the league objected to cigar and cigarette smoke on street cars and said the custom should be stopped. It was not suggested whether the remedy for the evil should be a prohibitive city ordinance, an order from the street car companies or the Keeley treatment. The question was laid over until the next meeting.
