

## HE USED UNION LABELS.

### Nicholas Boos, Cigarmaker, Arrested, Charged With Counterfeiting.

Members of the Cigarmakers' union appeared before Justice Latshaw yesterday morning and made complaint against Nicholas Boos, a cigar manufacturer at Thirteenth and Main, charging him with counterfeiting stamps bearing the union label. A warrant for Boos was issued and was served by Constable Shannon and Deputy Constable Kilrain. Boos was arraigned and pleaded not guilty. His examination was set for Tuesday next at 2 p. m., and he was released on \$200 bond. The punishment for the offense charged is a fine of from \$100 to \$5,000, or from three months to one year in jail or both.

Boos claims to have had the permission of the union to use the stamps, but this the union men deny. They say he had this permission three years ago but had been warned for months past against the use of the stamps. The case will attract much attention, as it is the first brought in the city under an act of the last legislature the purport of which is to protect union labels.
