

Hum Hok Laid to Rest.

Hum Hok, the Chinese laundryman who died Monday at Fifth and Cherry streets, was buried in Union cemetery yesterday afternoon, with the most elaborate Chinese funeral ceremonies. The funeral procession of eight or ten carriages started from Cariat's undertaking establishment and was headed by a Chinese band. A white and red triangular flag was upon the hearse, and the usual scraps of holy paper were scattered along the streets to protect the dead man's soul from the charms of the evil spirit. The whole service was carried on in the most complete Mongolian fashion.
