

## COLLECTING GARBAGE.

### Complaints Received From a Large Number of Householders.

Garbage Contractor Skipner held a long conference with the assistant sanitary superintendent yesterday regarding the garbage matter and Dr. Waring gave some additional instructions regarding the disposal of garbage. He instructed the contractor to have his men visit every house in the city, whether there are garbage receptacles or not. The complaints are coming in very fast that the contractor has not visited houses. If the reports of householders are to be believed, there are from ten to twenty houses in each block which have not been visited. City Engineer Donnelly says he has never seen the color of the hair of a garbage man at his house. Mr. Mason, of the board of public works, has, however, a complaint of an opposite character to make. Mr. Holmes says his garbage can is running over and has been for several days. Mr. Tiernan says the same, and so it goes. There is a stack of complaints in the office of the board a foot high, but it is thought that the instructions of Dr. Waring will have the effect of calling public attention to the necessity of having garbage cans in a more direct and convincing manner than by any other method.

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
