

COMPLAINTS MULTIPLYING.

The Garbage Contractor Hears From Householders.

Assistant Sanitary Superintendent Waring said yesterday that there was no use disguising the fact that despite the utmost efforts of the board of health the garbage contractor still left hundreds of houses without collecting the garbage. The complaints from householders who have provided themselves with cans in response to the repeated importunities of the board of health, and who have not seen the color of the contractor's garbage wagon, are increasing with the advent of the heated term.

The complaints, as fast as filed, are turned over to the contractor and the complaint wagon is sent to the scene of the trouble. The contractor himself places a great deal of his difficulty with the drivers of his wagons, and he says that he has hired fully 300 drivers since he took the contract. He hires and discharges scores of drivers every week, and he would pay excellent wages to the driver who would not leave any cause for complaint, but such a paragon of perfection is probably running some more profitable business than driving a garbage wagon.

Dr. Waring said that he was of the opinion that the contractor was not to be blamed if his men missed some houses, but he was not to be excused from missing whole rows of houses all the time. The doctor said that with the exercise of a little patience the system would be working to the complete satisfaction of everybody before the summer is out.
