

FRUIT AUCTION TUESDAY.

Opening of a New Exchange and a Departure in Business Methods.

The time for throwing the new Kansas City Fruit and Produce exchange open to the public has been changed from tomorrow to Tuesday at 2 p. m. Manager Roland E. Bruner has been unusually active for some time past getting the interior of the magnificent new building at Second and Main streets into shape for the big display. Several car-loads of fruit and produce have already been received, and when the loads that are on the way from California and elsewhere reach here tomorrow the building will be pretty well filled. Tuesday afternoon Mr. Bruner will mount the stand and everything received up to that time will be sold at auction. Fresh supplies will be received and a sale held every day. It should be a matter of congratulation to Kansas Cityans that the building of the Kansas City Fruit, Auction and Cold Storage company is considered by competent judges from other cities who have inspected it as the finest fruit exchange building in the country, and the auction room as undoubtedly the largest, with the possible exception of those at Chicago and New Orleans.

The commission men are looking favorably upon the new enterprise, and several of them have already engaged office room at the exchange and will establish headquarters there.
