

## FEARLESS MISS SQUIRES.

She Will Dive Into Washington Park Lake  
From a Height of Fifty  
Feet.

For some time Miss Madeline Squires has been recognized as one of the most fearless aeronauts in this country. She is ambitious to achieve the same distinction in another dangerous sport, high diving. For some time she has been practicing diving and is now confident of her ability to dive off a high tower without breaking her neck. Washington park will



witness her first attempt at high diving tomorrow afternoon. The first attempt will be from a height of fifty feet. Should she be successful she will attempt a higher jump and she hopes very soon to be able to equal and perhaps break the records of Leuvenmark and young Ridgeway.

Miss Squires is absolutely without fear but does not lack prudence. She recognizes the danger of such an undertaking and that a mistake may prove fatal, but she has decided to make a record for herself and will not hesitate when the time comes.

This afternoon E. S. Ridgeway, who recently broke Leuvenmark's record at Pertle Springs, will make a dive from a height of eighty feet. He will also dive Sunday afternoon after Miss Squires has made her dive.

The spring-fed lake is a delightful place to cool off during the warm weather and offers great inducements to the bathers. The excellent Washington Park band will render a special programme under the direction of Professor Zimmer-schled.
