

Edison has completed his arrangements for showing his kinetograph at the world's fair. It is a very curious invention, but useful only in a show way. Every gesture of a speaker may be photographed and at the same time his words may be recorded on the cylinder of a phonograph. The two devices are then combined by throwing the photograph on a screen and starting the talking machine, and the observer sees and hears an exact reproduction of the speech. The deception is said to be most remarkable.
