OPPOSITION FOR BUFFALO BILL.

Dr. Carver Will Soon Have a Wild West Show on the Road.

Dr. W. F. Carver, who is at the Grand

opera house this week in the border drama, "The Scout," is reorganizing his company on an extensive scale for the summer season. His plans are to give the drama as a tent show and make one week stands in all the big cities. He will expend something like \$20,000 in getting the show together. He has purchased a 250 foot round top tent, which will be fitted up with a stage of sufficient size to give room for the appearance of 120 people at one time, including sixty Indians and forty cowboys. The stage will be fitted up with special scenery and a mammoth tank of water for the drop through the bridge and the battle between Indians and cowboys in the water. The tent will have a seating capacity of 5,000.

The play is to be reconstructed so as take in sensational features not possible in a theater, including cow roping by the cowboys, Carver's rifle shooting on horseback at full gallop, and Indians in the ghost dance. His Indians are to be composed of Navajoes, Apaches, Comanches, Brules and Ogallala Sioux, who will be bedecked with all the splendors of Indian costumes and jewelry, Dr. Carver, having this week purchased from ex-Alderman James Finlay, recently post trader at Pine Ridge, a lot of costumes, arms and Indian curios. Carver has been a visitor at the horse sales at the Kansas City stock yards daily and has purchased over eighty head of horses and several steers for the show. It will require a train of fourteen cars to transport the show and there will be upwards of 250 men.
