

CHINESE WILL NOT FIGHT.

The Report That Registration Will Be Resisted Positively Denied.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 27.—The Chinese vice consul brands as a fabrication a report that the Chinese Six companies have issued circulars advising Chinamen in the United States to resist the provisions of the Geary law by force. "We will submit peacefully to the laws of the country," said the vice consul, "and before May 5 next we shall issue a warning to the Chinese to acquiesce in imprisonment if need be but never to resist. What we expect is an arrest when the matter will be taken to the United States circuit. We know and our lawyers know that the nearer the day comes for the enforcement of the Geary law, the more afraid of it are the men who framed and advocated the measure. I believe it will never stand a test in the courts and they know as well that if an attempt is made to enforce it before its constitutionality is determined the United States may be asked some questions by the nations of the earth that will be hard to answer. With affairs in the Hawaiian islands in the present condition, an international imbroglio with China upon the question of treaties is not desired by Cleveland or his cabinet."

Manager Fine of the Six companies says advices have been received from Washington that Mr. Cleveland assured the Chinese minister the United States will do "what is right" about the matter.
