

HOGERTY GETS A JOB AT LAST.

He Will Be a Chinese Inspector at Four Dollars a Day.

WASHINGTON, June 27.—[Special.] Captain Hogerty, of Kansas City, Kas., has at last been given an appointment. He says that he secured a place despite the fact that Senator Martin recommended Confederate soldiers in preference to himself, and despite the fact that the senator under no conditions would do anything for him. He is a one-armed soldier with a good soldier record, but he found little consolation in the senator, who, he states, is saturated with the views of the border ruffian legislature, which he took into his system when he was clerk of that distinguished body. Hogerty says he got this place because all the other factions in Kansas asked it.

Possibly of late, he adds, the senator would not have been able to do anything for him, had he been so inclined, but that does not appease the captain in the least as he is of the opinion that at one time, before the fight in Kansas was decided against the senator, he would have been able to do something for him.

He ascribes his victory to the other fellows and especially to Colonel Jones, who made a strong talk to-day, which was followed by the appointment. Jones stated that the attitude of the administration towards Hogerty was a direct slap at the old soldiers of Kansas, and nothing had been done by the administration that would be so effective in making that element fight the administration as the fact that a one armed veteran had been haughtily snubbed, and even from the state of Kansas, two Confederates had been given the very places that Hogerty desired. Jones made a very energetic talk on the politics of the case, and in this way secured the appointment.

Hogerty gets \$4 per day and expenses as Chinese inspector. He has not been located so far, but it is thought he will be assigned to Kansas City. This is the place he commenced to work for some time ago, as stated in these dispatches.
