### WATCHED BY THE POLICE.

**A Brother of the Daltons Under Surveillance at the Instance of Barber Seemans.**

"Bill" Dalton of Coffeyville, Kas., a brother of the Dalton boys, who were shot in the raid on the Coffeyville banks October 5, 1892, has been at the Hotel Ryus, Kansas City, Kas., since Saturday night. He came in with stock, which he sold at the stock yards.

Since his arrival he has been under the surveillance of the police at the instance of Cary Seemans, a barber, of Kansas City, Kas., who formerly lived in Coffeyville and who took part in the street battle on the day of the raid. When he heard that Dalton was in town he became alarmed and, although "Bill" Dalton was always considered a reputable citizen, Seemans reported his fear that Dalton was on a mission of vengeance to Chief of Police Denison of Kansas City, Kas. Detective Cahill was detailed to shadow Dalton and followed him till 2 o'clock Sunday morning. He spent the greater part of the night in the gambling houses near the State line and came out ahead of the game. Yesterday he was at the stock yards the greater part of the time. The police now think the surveillance was unnecessary.
