
SWIFT JUSTICE IN KANSAS.

Emmet Dalton Arraigned, Sentenced and Sent to Prison in an Hour.

INDEPENDENCE, Kas., March 8.—Emmet Dalton, the surviving member of the notorious gang which raided the banks of Coffeyville December 8, 1892, was brought before Judge McCue at 9 o'clock this morning, charged with murder in the first degree, but, by agreement of counsel on both sides, he pleaded guilty to murder in the second degree. He was at once sentenced to the penitentiary for life at hard labor, and by 10 o'clock was on his way thither in charge of the sheriff and three guards.

A. Connelly, a student at Spalding's Commercial college, a son of Marshal C. T. Connelly, who was killed in the Dalton raid at Coffeyville last fall, received a dispatch at noon today from Independence, Kas., telling him of the verdict in the case of Emmet Dalton. He is very much pleased with the result and regards the sentence as a just one.
