WISE TO ROBBERY; YOUTH MURDERED

A KANSAS CITY CAPITALIST
FEARS FOR SON'S LIFE.

MISSING FOR SOME TIME

CAREY SNYDER WAS SENT TO
MONTANA AFTER KANSAS
CITY ROBBERY.

Robbed Pawn Broker of \$5,000 in 1904
—Was Paroled Last Sept.—Be-
lieved He Was Killed by Men
Who Robbed Ore., Bank.

Kansas City, Jan. 19.—R. M. Snyder, a well known capitalist of this city, received a telegram from Portland, Ore., today indicating that his son, Carey Snyder, had been murdered by men suspected of a bank robbery concerning which crime Young Snyder was supposed to know too much. The bank robbed was at Forest Grove, Ore., and the authorities at Forest Grove and Portland notified the police of this city tonight that they suspect Carey Snyder, "Pinky" Blitz and George Perry, all of whom are well known in Kansas City, of committing the robbery. Blitz and Perry, who are cousins, are notorious police characters here, and Snyder has been involved in serious trouble.

FATHER TO GO TO OREGON.

R. M. Snyder said today that he did not believe his son had been killed, but that he would go to Portland soon to investigate the case. He thinks that his son has run away to escape trial on a charge of shooting cattle which has been preferred against him in Oregon.

"Pinky" Blitz was released from the penitentiary of Missouri about a year ago when he completed a sentence for swindling in this city. Blitz has been charged with numerous offenses in this city and St. Louis, and he is well known as a pickpocket and all around crook.

George Perry was seen in Independence, Mo., as late as last Monday. He was well dressed and seemed to be well supplied with money. Perry has lived practically all his life in Independence. About three years ago he was arrested on the charge of holding up and robbing a saloon keeper of several hundred dollars. He was acquitted of the charge and soon after disappeared from Independence. He returned periodically, but his last absence was for a long time.

ROBBED PAWN BROKER IN 1904.

Carey Snyder was convicted here in 1904 of the charge of holding up and robbing a pawn broker of jewelry valued at \$5,000. He was captured in Montana after a chase lasting sixteen months, the robbery having occurred May 1, 1902. He was paroled in September, 1905, and was allowed to leave the state. Shortly after his father, R. M. Snyder, sent him to a ranch near Hillsboro, Ore. Young Snyder was arrested last November charged with shooting a neighbor's cattle and was released on bond. The bank at Forest Grove was robbed December 2 last of \$6,000, and about the same time Snyder and Perry, who had been his chum, disappeared. Officers have not been able to find either since then.
