

“Blinkey Bob” to Go Back to Answer a Charge of Murder.

This morning the matter of Dick Jones, alias Bob Williams, alias Blinkey Bob, was called before Judge Noonan. The defendant was charged with being a fugitive from justice, and was surrendered to Detective Gaster from New Orleans. On April 25, 1882, Williams and a man named Charles Dyers had a dispute about a negress. When Dyers, who was a sailor, left the saloon to go to his schooner Williams followed, and, coming up behind his victim, stabbed him twenty-seven times with a gimlet knife. Twelve of the wounds were necessarily fatal, and death resulted within an hour. Williams escaped and was missing for two years. Detectives Lawler and Desmond learned that he was in the city and on last Saturday they arrested him as he was boarding the steamboat Montana. He denied that he was the man wanted, but was soon identified, and subsequently confessed. He will be taken back to stand trial.

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
