Captain George G. Keith tenders his resignation of master of the steamer New Idlewild to-day to accept the command of the steamer A. L. Mason, taking charge of her on her arrival to-morrow. Captain Keith is no stranger, and is well and popularly known along the banks of the Missouri river from St. Louis to the Rocky mountains, having commenced steamboating there when a youth, and as a master, pilot and navigator has no superiors. He has to his credit the bringing out of that stream the largest cargo that ever came out on any one steamer, he bringing by the steamer Dacotah in 1884 a manifest of 16,720 sacks of wheat, 550 packages sundries and 52 hogs on 5 1-2 feet of water, never setting a spar.
