## SAYS MITCHELL WILL WIN.

Bat Masterson Thinks Corbett Will More Than Meet His Match.

Bat Masterson, known throughout the country as one of the land-marks of Dodge City in its most palmy days, now of Denver, passed through this city yesterday on his way to Nashville, where he goes with the famous book-maker of Denver, Howard Baldwin, for the purpose of making books on the coming races.

He also thinks that while Jim Corbett is the best man that America ever produced, Charley Mitchell is his master and will whip him to a moral certainty. Masterson hoots at the idea that Mitchell will surrender his rights to meet Corbett to Peter Jackson, and says that nothing but death or failure on Corbett's part will keep Mitchell from appearing at the ring-side ready and willing to meet the American champion.
