

MRS. POTTER FOR MAYOR.

A Plucky Business Woman with Pronounced Views on Municipal Matters.

Mrs. Anna Potter authorizes the statement that she is receiving many encouraging letters from friends in this city as well as in all parts of the country endorsing her candidacy and wishing her success in her efforts to bring about a revolution in municipal government.

Mrs. Potter is not a politician in the sense that a majority of our male political workers are politicians; but she is a broad, liberal-minded woman with very pronounced views on municipal government. She thinks that if the intelligent women of the city can have a voice in the management of our city's affairs hoodling, corruption, mismanagement and all forms of malfeasance in office, will soon be a thing unheard of.
