

## Today's Electric Line Story.

The esteemed Leavenworth Times began construction on the Kansas City-St. Joe electric line again this morning. It will cross the Winner bridge at Kansas City and will run in a direct line to St. Joe. The construction and equipment will cost \$750,000, and it is expected to have the line in operation by fall. The Times says work on the road began at St. Joe yesterday. The length of the line will be 47 miles and the schedule time of the trains an hour and forty-five minutes. Parkville and Platte City will be on the new line. The power house will be located at Platte City.

Leavenworth hopes that a branch will be built from Platte City to tap Leavenworth. To date Atchison hasn't been dealt a hand in the new game, but the "pipe" artist of the Times closed his eyes wearily at the end of the story and hoped that it would not be many years before Leavenworth, Atchison, St. Joe and Kansas City would be connected by electric lines on both sides of the river. There is probably something doing in electric line circles. The Winner bridge was sold the other day, and it isn't likely anybody would buy it for an ornament.
